Who has the right to vote?!

- Every citizen of Georgia who has reached the age of 18 years before the election/referendum/plebiscite day and meets the provisions established by the Election Code has the right to vote.
- A citizen of Georgia, imprisoned for a particularly serious crime or recognized as a recipient of support by a court decision and placed in a relevant inpatient medical institution, is not eligible to participate in elections, referendums and plebiscites.

Types of elections

Elections of the municipal representative bodies - Sakrebulo (City Council)

- Sakrebulo elections are held on the first Saturday of October of the election year. President of Georgia, with the signature of the Prime Minister of Georgia, calls the elections.
- A citizen of Georgia aged 21 by the voting day, who has lived in Georgia for at least five years, may be elected a member of the City Council.
- Sakrebulo elections are held based on proportional and single-mandate electoral systems.

Mayoral elections

- The mayor of a self-governing city, and the mayor of a self-governing community, is elected for a four-year term.
- A citizen of Georgia aged 25 and above, who has lived in Georgia for at least five years and has a voting right, can be elected mayor.
- The candidate who receives more than 50% of the votes cast in the election shall be considered the winner.
- Invalid ballots will not be counted in the number of votes cast in the elections.
